**Yes, if the person wishes to shorten self-isolation / do not wish to test at the border**

If there is no negative test certificate, the test must be performed upon entry. If a person wishes to shorten the time of self-isolation, a second test is required not earlier than on the sixth day after the first test.

If a person has a negative test certificate, the test is not required when entering the country. If a person wishes to reduce the self-isolation time, a second test is required no earlier than the sixth day after the test on which the negative test certificate is based.
