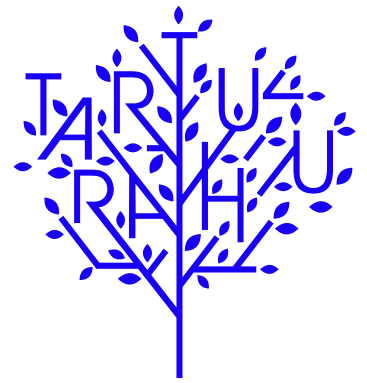


Tartu Peace 100

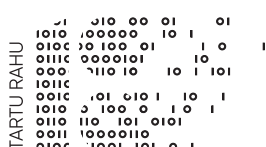
