#### Arriving from outside the European Union, the European Economic Area or the Schengen area

Travel to Estonia from outside the European Union, the European Economic Area or the Schengen area is possible, including for tourism, **only from the countries listed in Annex 1 of the recommendation of the Council of the European Union on the gradual lifting of the temporary restrictions on non-essential travel into the EU**. A 10-day self-isolation is mandatory for passengers arriving from a country on the list with an infection rate above 16.

Countries outside the European Union from which it is possible to travel to Estonia, including for tourism (according to the list in Annex 1 of the recommendation of the Council of the European Union)

- Australia
- New Zealand
- South Korea
- Rwanda
- Thailand
- Singapore

The data is gathered from ECDC official data.

When arriving from **third countries that are not listed in Annex I**, a mandatory 10-day self-isolation period applies to those, who are allowed entry to Estonia.

Citizens of third countries arriving in Estonia for the purpose of work or studying at an educational institution registered in Estonia from a third country not included in Annex 1 of the recommendation of the Council of the European Union, is subject to the 10-day mandatory self-isolation, and they must take a coronavirus test immediately after arriving in Estonia and a second test no earlier than six days after the first test.
